Introduction

Thank you for participating in this day of prayer for Holy Trinity Anglican Church. We have designed a prayer guide for your use, which follows the A. C. T. S. model. Your time in prayer will begin with Adoration (Praise), then Confession, followed by Thanksgiving, and will culminate in a time of Supplication for the ongoing ministries and mission of our church. In the Supplication section, we have provided you with a description of each of these ministries and specific prayer requests for each one.

We recommend that you spend about 5 minutes offering Adoration, Confession and Thanksgiving and 55 minutes for the Supplications and Closing Prayers, for a total of 60 minutes. With 17 ministries listed, you may need more time to pray for all of them. We hope you will be able to find additional time later in your day to offer Supplication on behalf of all Holy Trinity ministries.

Additional Recommendations

- Ask the Holy Spirit for direction before you begin.
- Listen as you pray for promptings by the Spirit, who may want to give you a new or different perspective from the one you have currently.
- Pray with confidence that our Father in heaven hears our prayers and will use them for great good in the life of our church.

Begin

Preparation for Prayer

Holy Spirit, breath of God and fire of love, I cannot pray without your aid: Kindle in me the fire of your love, and illumine me with your light; that with a steadfast will and holy thoughts I may approach the Father in spirit and in truth; through Jesus Christ my Lord, who reigns with you and the Father in eternal union. Amen. (2019 Book of Common Prayer, Anglican Church in North America, p. 675)

*Allow at least **5 minutes** for Adoration, Confession and Thanksgiving.*

Begin with **Adoration**, which is about acknowledging God's attributes, his works and his role in our lives.

Suggestions for Adoration

- Praise God for his might and power.
- Praise God for his enduring love.
- Praise God for the beauty of his creation.
- Praise God for his justice and holiness.
- Praise God for his tenderness.

Next, offer Confession. Confession is about acknowledging our sins before God, trusting in his steadfast love and mercy.

Suggested Confession

Most merciful God, I confess that I have sinned against you in thought, word and deed, by what I have done, and by what I have left undone. I have not loved you with my whole heart; I have not loved my neighbors as myself. I am truly sorry and I humbly repent.

(Pause. Name anything the Holy Spirit brings to mind for you to confess. Then, continue.)

For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on me and forgive me; that I may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your Name. Amen.

Declare the assurance of Forgiveness.

If we confess our sins, God is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. (1 John 1:9)

As far as the east is from the west, so far has God removed our transgressions from us. (Psalm 103:12)

Next, offer Thanksgiving. Thanksgiving is about acknowledging the Lord as the source of all good things in our life.

Suggestions for Thanksgiving

- For forgiveness.
- For answered prayer.
- For the blessings in your life.
- For things you take for granted.
- For unmerited and undeserved grace.
- For the ways in which God has blessed you through Holy Trinity Anglican Church.

*Allow **55 minutes** for Supplication and Closing Prayers. If you are unable to pray for all the ministries at this time, we encourage you to continue at a later time.*

Supplication is about asking God for what we need or desire and asking for such things on behalf of others.

Descriptions and prayer requests for the ministries of Holy Trinity continue on the following pages.

Care and Compassion Ministries

Description

These are ministries of pastoral care to members of the congregation by members of the congregation and include:

Home Communion Ministry

Home Communion ministers are sent out in teams of two to bring Communion to members who cannot come to church on Sunday because they are ill, homebound (temporarily or permanently) or recovering from surgery. Larry and Tina Dickerman coordinate this ministry and are assisted by Bev and Greg Mueffelmann, Grover and Cynthia Smith, and Randi and John Wood.

Neighborhood Meals Ministry

The geographical area in which members of Holy Trinity live has been divided into 14 “neighborhoods” and in each neighborhood one member of the church serves as a captain of that neighborhood. When someone in their neighborhood experiences the death of a loved one, the birth or adoption of a child, recovery from surgery or a difficult season of life, the captain will call, offer a meal and pray with them. Susan Finch coordinates this ministry.

Pastoral Visiting Ministry

Members who have been trained in how to offer confidential pastoral care visit and pray with members who are homebound, either temporarily due to illness or recovery from surgery, or permanently due to age or infirmity. Beth Black coordinates this ministry.

Practical Support Ministry

This ministry assists members who are in need of some practical help from time to time when they are incapacitated or physically unable to do something on their own. Examples of the kind of help offered are a ride to a medical appointment, assistance with a minor issue around the home or moving small household items. John Wood coordinates this ministry.

Prayer Requests

1. That members of our congregation who are in need for any reason will experience the love of Christ and come to know him better through these Care and Compassion Ministries.
2. That the Lord would bless and prosper the work of those who serve in these ministries and give them the right words to speak at the right time.

Center for Public Christianity

Description

The Center is a ministry in partnership with other area churches that seeks to equip, connect and mobilize Christians to lead in the cultural, social and spiritual renewal of the Triangle. It has three main programs: (1) New City Fellows, a discipleship program for emerging leaders mid-20s through 40s, (2) Public Forums, larger events featuring leading Christian thinkers engaged in conversation on topics of relevance to our culture for the public good and (3) Gatherings, which are further equipping and fellowship events for fellows alumni and their networks.

Prayer Requests

1. That the Lord would prepare the hearts of the New City Fellows for a transformative year of growth in grace, fellowship and learning.
2. That God would form strong relationships with new partner churches for ministry to the city.
3. That God would use the upcoming year's forums to strengthen and further the church's winsome, persuasive witness to the gospel in our city and that non-Christians would be attracted to the faith and to Jesus Christ.
4. That God would continue to grow, enrich and use the fellows alumni as they seek the renewal of Raleigh through their vocations, involvement with word and deed ministry in the city and through the establishment of new ministries.
5. That God would ordain the steps of the leadership team as it seeks to establish long-term strategic plans.

Community Groups

Description

Community groups are small groups of Holy Trinity parishioners who gather consistently throughout the year and are living out the gospel together in grace. We do this by studying the Bible, caring for one another, praying for each other and serving the needs of our community in Jesus' name.

Prayer Requests

1. That God would raise up new leaders.
2. For new groups that have begun this year and that more would launch.
3. That more people will join a community group.
4. That the community groups would be places of discipleship and pastoral care.
5. That the community groups would be places where the 'one another' passages of the New Testament would be lived out.
6. That relationships would be forged and strengthened within each community group.
7. That each group would love one another by showing up regularly and being prepared to participate.
8. That each group would wrestle in prayer for one another and be open to sharing life together.
9. That the attitude and posture of each member would be other person-centered and that, like Jesus, we would be prepared to lay down our life for the sake of others.

Family Ministry

Description

The Family Ministry endeavors to disciple students (ages 0-18), equip parents and foster community among families. It includes:

Children's Ministry

This ministry champions the interests of children birth through fifth grade.

Sunday Morning: The Young Children's wing is open for littles under the age of 5. Vetted youth helpers serve once a month within this wing! Grade school-aged children are invited to their own time of Bible teaching during the service to hear a gospel teaching in a kid-friendly way. They follow the cross out after the Scripture reading during the gospel song and return right before the Communion liturgy within the service.

Trinity Kids on Mission: This Monday through Friday summer half-day camp empowers and commissions children to serve God's Kingdom. It offers a local and global curriculum to expand children's understanding of how God is on the move. This experience includes live worship, Bible teaching, snacks, crafts, small group time and recreation.

4|5 KREW: This is a bi-monthly gathering of 4th and 5th grade kids. It offers space and time for older children to connect, as well as bridges the gap into youth group.

Miscellaneous Events/Discipleship Material: There are periodic offerings throughout the year for families such as our Lent in a Bag resource, family Advent devotionals, book clubs, community Easter egg hunts, Carols by Glowstick and Trunk or Treat. These touchpoints are ways for children and families to connect and grow in their devotion to Jesus and discipleship rhythms.

Baptism Preparation: Baptism is a family event. Parents of infants are invited to learn about the meaning of baptism and the responsibility of raising their child in the faith, as well as the parts of the baptism liturgy.

First Communion Class: This yearly spring class is offered for children who are ready and wanting to come to the communion table. Kids hear about the tenets of Christian faith during this 5-week class. Parents are encouraged to attend the class alongside their child.

Student Ministry

This ministry champions the interests of students in grades 6 through 12.

Youth Group: This is a weekly Sunday evening gathering of students for games, food, worship and teaching. Students grow in relationship with one another, as well as with the adult leaders who mentor them.

Mid-Week Gatherings: These are intentional times set aside within the week to dive into Scripture. The gatherings are based on grade (middle/high school) and gender.

Confirmation: This is an offering for 8th graders and above to confirm the faith they have received from their parents. Students learn about the gospel and core tenets of the faith, as well as aspects of Anglicanism. The capstone to this process is an overnight retreat where students share their faith story. Students are confirmed by the bishop in front of the whole church as he lays hands on them.

Retreats: The fall beach retreat and winter ski retreat are times to unplug from the normal routines of life and connect deeply with God and others. They run Friday through Sunday and combine lots of hangout time with deep gospel truths.

Summer Service Week: Students have the opportunity to expand their view of God's work in Raleigh by serving Holy Trinity's local outreach partners. Youth serve in the morning with a variety of different organizations around the city. The last day of the week is a day of fun.

One-on-One Meetings: These are times when leaders meet with individuals or groups of students to talk about life and faith.

Senior Send-Off: Graduating seniors are invited to the front of the church and are commissioned into their next adventure. Parents join their child on stage and lay hands on them as the congregation prays for them.

Family Ministry

This ministry focuses on the whole family but with particular emphasis on adults.

Dinner and Discussion: Parents connect over a meal and discuss topics that are relevant to their students. Topics in the past have included technology and sexuality.

Prayer Requests

1. That young people at Holy Trinity would know the gospel, their identity in Christ and foster deep relationships that encourage them daily.
2. That young people would feel empowered and commissioned to point their peers to the abundant life found in Jesus.
3. That parents would have the wisdom, determination and resources to disciple their children and lead their families well.
4. That everyone involved in the Family Ministry would have the discipline and drive to encounter God in an ever-increasing manner.

Fellowship Ministries

Description

As the body of Christ, we are part of a new family, and the joy of being part of God's family is being known and loving others. Everything we do at Holy Trinity gives us the opportunity to share our lives with one another. In particular, two ministries focus solely on fellowship through gatherings over a meal or refreshments in a member's home to deepen relationships and friendships.

Thanking God in Friendship (TGIF)

The ministry of TGIF provides in-home gatherings over an informal meal for all Holy Trinity members and newcomers. Randi Wood coordinates this ministry.

Prayer Requests

1. That the Lord shows us additional formats while keeping it informal, in-home and fellowship-focused over the breaking of bread together.
2. That TGIF gatherings continue to be protected, including from the spread of COVID.
3. That the Lord brings forth more hosts so that we can continue to develop new friendships with others at Holy Trinity.
4. That our gatherings would be mutually beneficial and encouraging for all who attend.

Single Women's Quarterly Gatherings

We have an amazing group of single women – never married, divorced and widowed – of all ages at Holy Trinity. To give us an opportunity to connect informally, we meet quarterly for light refreshments in a member's home.

Prayer Requests

1. That God would draw our women together in friendship and mutual support.
2. That each woman would feel loved and cared for.

Finance and Administration

Description

This ministry focuses on the business aspects of the church, including financial management, communications, technology management, human resources/benefits, facility management and church operations. It also works closely with church committees to manage special projects and facilitate lay involvement in church matters.

Prayer Requests

Financial Management

1. For wisdom for the members of the Finance Committee so that they can be good stewards of the resources that God has entrusted to us.
2. For a smooth stewardship season in October and November so that resources are available to run the church in a manner that is pleasing to the Lord.

2. For the administrative staff, including Susan Finch, Jake Fritzke, Sheri Jackson, Susan Josephson and Anne Thompson, that they can execute programs and events well and that they can work well with all members of our staff and parish.

Facility Management

1. For the safety of everyone who comes onto our campus, that they are protected from physical and/or emotional injury.
2. For the protection of all church systems, including fire, air conditioning, heating, porches, stairways, roofs, etc., so that they can function properly.

1. For good judgement for the members of the Real Estate, Interior and Personnel Committees and that their work honors the Lord.

Description

It is entirely lay-led for a time of fellowship, prayer and a deeper look into God's love letter to us. Leaders usually provide breakfast biscuits and coffee is provided. John Wood leads this ministry.

Men's Dinners and Fellowship

Fellowship over a casual dinner is followed by either a Bible talk and table discussion or a short talk from one of our brothers about how the gospel is transforming his life.
